My name is [YOUR NAME HERE] and I am your constituent. I am writing to request that you support three important pieces of legislation that will help to end Washington State's mass incarceration crisis and the havoc it has wreaked on communities of color.

- ***Young Adult ISRB Review***: Increase the age of consideration for ISRB (juvenile parole) review under the *Miller* fix from 18 to 25. This would not only make our sentencing practices in-line with current brain science but would also help move WA towards racial justice since there are a disproportionate number of Black young adults given exceptionally long sentences.
- ***Restore Earned Release Time***: Restore earned release time (ERT) to one-third on all convictions without exclusions for mandatory minimum terms, sentence enhancements, or other provisions that prevent good time on any portion of a sentence.
- ***Eliminate the Use of Juvenile Points in Adult Offender Score Calculations***: Retroactively ban the use of juvenile points in adult offender score calculations. This practice is inherently tied to the over-policing of communities of color and has resulted in people of color receiving disproportionately long sentences. In order to rectify this, recalculate a person's offender score and automatically resentencing them to the lower end of their new sentencing range. This would ensure the recalculations are cost efficient as they will not involve the courts.
